EZRide

Signup

- No option to create an account until you need a ride (“fill out application” instead)
- Redirects to another service (NJRideShare)
- Only applicable for people in certain organizations (need some ID?)

Signup for NJRideShare

- Name (first/middle/last)
- “How you heard of us” (yes this is required)
- Email
- Phone number (optional)
- Address
- Work address (filled in automatically when you select an organization)
- Schedule
- Preferred form of commute (alone/carpool/etc)
- Text box for misc. Comments (Scott wanted to try the Bobby Tables thing)
- Typical Terms of Conditions, “don’t do things that would damage our servers,” “don’t steal passwords,” etc.

Rates and things (not sure if I got these right)

- Allows you to use Lyft/Uber rates plus \$1 “administrative fee”
- Reduced rates for seniors
- Has a bus network
- “How it works” section is the dictionary definition of carpooling, not how the actual *service* works
- Allows user to negotiate pricing when carpooling

- Ask users to identify themselves by using work identification (when applicable)

Bonnect

- Can't use if you've been arrested for any reason at all
- No driver requirements - literally anyone can be a driver (probably except for the above?)
- You don't even have to use your real name
- "Rules" page 404s on mobile (but works on desktop)
- Has built-in messaging
- Has a marketplace (which is probably not moderated)

Phone app

- "Requests" and "offers" tabs at the top
- If you're not logged in, it shows sample ride requests/offers (this *sounds* like an actually good idea)
- Set up a ride through text chat
- Marketplace likely uses the same text chat system, but there weren't any screenshots
